



Regulations for Diving Courses Registration and Payment

- I. Definitions
 1. Basic, advanced, specialty and professional diving courses, known as Course - are recreational diving trainings
 2. The course may take the form of a theoretical lecture, practical classes in confined waters or in the form of training diving in open waters
 3. The organizer of the course is the Aquanaut Diving - Patrycja Mielimąka,

 4. Aquanaut Diving is the owner of the internet service operating at www.aquanaut.pl - in short called Website

- II. Participants
 1. The participant of the course can be any person who meets the formal requirements of participation and will express by e-mail, telephone, using the application form on the Website or in another, customary, manner of willingness to participate in a diving course
 2. The participant, when registering for the course, accepts the rules set out in these regulations.
 3. The participant should provide the data necessary to issue an invoice and a certificate.

- III. Responsibilities of the course organizer
 1. Aquanaut takes care of safety at the place where the course takes place, in accordance with the relevant legal regulations.
 2. Aquanaut provides course compliant with PADI standards.
 3. The instructor conducting the course reports to the PADI participants for the purposes of certification of the Participants after successfully passing all the requirements of the course.

- IV. Forms of payment
 1. Cash - payable at the first class as part of the course
 2. Payment to the account - bank transfer to Aquanaut account:

 5. Aquanaut reserves the right to limit and make available other forms of payment based on individual arrangements

- V. Courses
 1. Diving trainings take place at dates and places agreed in advance with the Students
 2. Courses are conducted by PADI instructors with appropriate qualifications and competences
 3. Aquanaut provides the opportunity to change the date of the course and / or the place of the course. In this situation, all participants will be informed by e-mail or telephone. In the event of such a change, Participants have the right to withdraw from the course, and Aquanaut undertakes to return 100% of the paid amount.
 4. In the event that the course is canceled for reasons beyond the control of Aquanaut, it undertakes to conduct the course on a new date, without charging any additional fees.

VI. Complaints and Returns

1. Participants have the right to complaints related to, among others with the level of education and organizational shortcomings. Complaints should be submitted by e-mail or by post to the Aquanaut address. Complaints will be considered within 14 days from the date of receipt.
2. Course participants can send course reviews, opinions, both positive and critical reviews, as well as suggestions for organizational improvements, etc. via e-mail. All such suggestions will be considered by the Organizer with particular care.
3. The student may withdraw from participation in the training within 14 days without giving a reason in accordance with the Act on Consumer Rights of 30 May 2014 (Journal of Laws of 2014, item 827, as amended).
4. The period starts from the moment of reporting on the course.
5. Upon withdrawal from participation in the course, the Participant will be reimbursed the sums paid in addition to the costs already incurred by Aquanaut (training materials, swimming pool sessions, open water dives).

VII. Personal data protection

1. in accordance with the Act on the Protection of Personal Data of 29 August 1997 (Journal of Laws of 29 October 1997, No. 133, item 833.), Aquanaut does not transfer, sell or lend collected personal data of users to other people or institutions except PADI. However, personal data provided by the participant will be processed by Aquanaut for purposes of verification of course requirements, training, PADI certification and for communication between the Instructor and the Participant.
2. In the above-mentioned scope, the Participants by agreeing to participate in the course agree to the processing of their personal data by Aquanaut in order to conduct the course.
3. In order to complete the certification application, the following form should be provided on the appropriate form: name, surname, date of birth, place of residence, sex and your photo. The participant may provide these data to the instructor and thereby agree to complete the application or enter them yourself.

VIII. Final Provisions

1. These regulations enter into force on 21/05/2018
2. Matters not covered by these regulations shall be governed by the provisions of Polish law, in particular the Civil Code, the Act on the Protection of Certain Consumer Rights and Liability for Damage Caused by a Dangerous Product (Journal of Laws No. 22 of 2000, item 271) and the Act on special terms of consumer sales and amendments to the Civil Code (Journal of Laws No. 141 of 2002, item 1176).
3. Aquanaut Diving, the organizer of diving courses, wants to provide the participants with the highest substantive and organizational level of courses, hence issues not covered in these regulations will be considered in accordance with common sense and customary solutions, primarily beneficial to the students.
